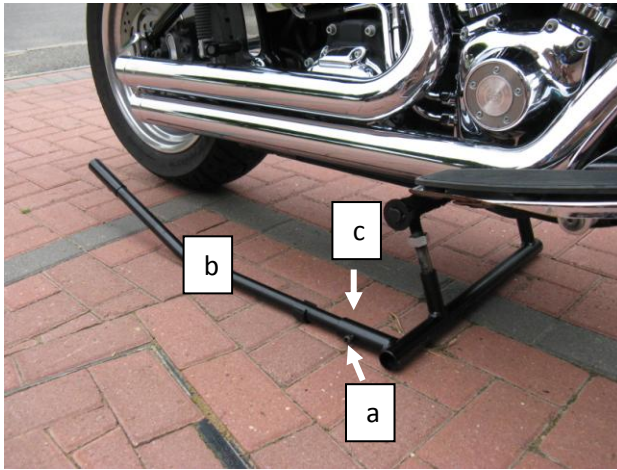




HARLEY LIFTER USER GUIDE



To assemble your Harley Lifter, please undo the bolt on the bottom of the handle (a), and slide the handle (b) into the bottom bar (c), and then tighten the bolt.

The threaded bar is height adjustable, by turning the nuts either clockwise or anti-clockwise and can be adjusted to suit yourself and your bike.

The lower the top bar of the Harley Lifter is set, the easier it is to raise your bike from the ground.

Firstly, when using the Harley Lifter, we would recommend that you keep the side stand down on the other side of the bike to which you are placing the Harley Lifter. This is so that when you remove the Harley Lifter you can put the bike on the stand without any danger of dropping your bike. Also please ensure you are on a level surface.

We would recommend that you have someone with you the first time you use the Harley Lifter, or until you have the “knack” in case you need some help with your bike.

Slide the top and bottom bar of the Harley Lifter under the bike frame, depending on where you put the Harley Lifter you will raise either the front or back wheel off of the ground.

To raise the bike, whilst holding on to your bike slowly push the Harley Lifter handle towards the ground. The Harley Lifter will take the weight of the bike on the top bar, where the tubular grips will protect your frame. Once the handle is pushed fully to the floor, the bike should be secure on the Harley Lifter, with either wheel off the ground.



Please do not let go of your bike until you feel it is secure, and you are happy to do so.

To remove your bike from the Harley Lifter, pull the handle up slowly, until you feel the weight of the bike is back on the ground. You should now be able to remove the Harley Lifter from under your bike. You can now lean your bike away from you on to the side stand.
